Minutes for January 31, 2017 17th Precinct Community Council Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m. by Matt Roberts, vice president of the community council.

State of Command

Deputy Inspector Nicole Papamichael presented the State of Command for 2016:

Precinct statistics:

Personnel:

25 supervisors in 2016; 25 in 2015—no change 109 officers in 2016, up from 106 in 2015 12 detectives in 2016; 12 in 2015—no change 20 civilians in 2016, up from 16 in 2015

Major Crimes:

1,000 reported in 2016, up from 989 reported in 2015

Murder/Homicide:

1 in 2016, and 1 in 2015

Rape:

10 in 2016, up from 3 in 2015

Robbery:

65 in 2016, up from 49 in 2015

Assault:

72 in 2016, down from 75 in 2015

Burglary:

84 in 2016, down from 98 in 2015

Grand Larceny:

742 in 2016, up from 723 in 2015

Grand Larceny, Auto: 26 in 2016, down from 40 in 2015

Arrest Activity:

Uniformed/Patrol 840 arrests in 2016, up from 704 in 2015 Detective Squad 241 arrests in 2016, up from 231 in 2015

<u>Summons Activity</u> (incl. moving violations, parking violations, criminal violations, and E.C.B. [that is, Environmental Control Board] violations): 16,990 in 2016, down from 18, 382 in 2015

3,844 in 2016, up from 3,680 in 2015
Traffic Fatalities
3 in 2016, and 3 in 2015
Pedestrian Injuries
191 in 2016, up from 185 in 2015
Bicyclist Injuries
91 in 2016, down from 100 in 2015

Deputy Inspector Papamichael and Captain Zaffiro, the precinct's executive officer, then answered community member questions and addressed various concerns, largely with regard to traffic issues and scam prevention.
