State of the Command

Deputy Inspector Sheerin gave the annual State of the Command report. We are down slightly in the number of officers assigned to the 7th Precinct. D. I. Sheerin anticipates a few more officers assigned to him shortly, once the recent graduates of the academy have completed their preliminary training.

Robbery: up slightly Felony Assault: down

Burglary: down

Grand Larceny: up (this will be a focus for 2014)

Grand Larceny Auto: down

D. I. Sheerin indicated that moving-traffic violations will be another focus for the 17th Precinct during the upcoming year. He conducted a brief question-and-answer session, covering issues such as Murray Hill traffic problems and the Copia "dance club" on 53rd Street.
